# Eight days of mountain adventure in three countries

#### DAV1

Arriving to airport in Krak, BUS transfer to Zakopane and the first short trip from Palenice Bialczańska to see Morskie Oko and accommodation in Zakopane with welcome dinner (PL).

#### DAY2

Full day trip from Zakopane - ascent to the national mountain of Poland Giewont and return trough the Kundratowa valley (possible to reach the peak of Gubalowka peak) Coming back to the hotel for the dinner.

#### DAY3

Full day trip from Roháč valley and ridge hiking over the peaks Brestová, Salatín, Spálená and Pachola. Returning around the waterfall Roháč. BUS transfer to hotel in Oravica (SVK) and dinner.

#### DAY4

Rest day with trip to Orava castle and rafting on the Orava river (wooden floaters), afternoon possibility to use termal spa in Oravica and dinner in the typical mountain restaurant.

#### DAY 5

Full day trip to western Carpathiens walking through Kvačianska valley, Prosiecka valley (rocky valleys, national landmark) and dinner at the hotel. BUS transfer to Ostravice (CZE)

### DAY 6

Full day trip with ascent to Lysá hora (highest mountain of the Moravian-Silesian Beskids range). Dinner in local brewery with possibility of excursion.

#### DAY7

Morning relax day in Open air museum Rožnov pod Radhoštěm and afternoon trip to Pustevny. Dinner at the hotel.

#### DAY8

After breakfast departure to the airport in Krakow / Katowice

The Western Tatras are mountains in the Tatras, part of the Carpathian Mountains, located on the Polish-Slovak borders. The mountains border the High Tatras in the east, Podtatranská kotlina in the south, Choč Mountains in the west and Rów Podtatrzański in the north. The main ridge is 37 kilometers long and the mountain range contains 31 two-thousanders. Western Tatras are the second highest mountain range both in Poland and Slovakia; its highest peak is Bystrá at 2,248 meters. Other notable mountains include Jakubiná (2,194 m), Baranec (2,184 m), Baníkov (2,178 m), Tri kopy (2,136.3 m), Plačlivé (2,125.1 m), Ostrý Roháč (2,087.5 m), Volovec,, Kasprowy Wierch and Giewont (1,894 m). In Slovakia, they are partially located in the traditional regions of Liptov and Orava. The highest point in Poland is Starorobociański Wierch (2,176 m).
